**ROLL CALL** - Present: Rob Haynes, Matt Severino, Lisa Nargi, Patricia Dziubek and Frank Mazza. J. Peter Jost, Esq., Township Attorney, John Reymann, P.E., Township Engineer, and Ella Malecki Ruta, Township Clerk, were also present.

**APPROVAL OF MINUTES**

a. Regular and Executive Session Meeting Minutes of September 5, 2007

Motion was made by Mrs. Nargi, seconded by Mr. Severino to adopt said Minutes. Vote – Ayes: Mr. Haynes, Mr. Severino, Mrs. Nargi, Mrs. Dziubek, Mr. Mazza. Motion Carried.

At this time Twp. Attorney, Peter Jost announced results of Bid Opening on September 19, 2007 at 11:00 AM for Aluminum Dump Body, Central Hydraulic System, Snowplow and Material Spreader. The only Bid received from US Municipal Supply Inc. PO Box 574, Huntington, PA in the amount of \$31,324.00 was opened at 11:00 AM in presence of Peter J. Jost, Twp. Attorney and Ella M. Ruta, Municipal Clerk. After Attorney Jost reviewed the Bid he stated that all documents were in order and no exceptions to bid specifications were made by the Bidder. It was Attorney Jost recommendation that the Committee accepts the bid.

It was stated for the record by Attorney Jost of another Bid package for Aluminum Dump Body, delivered by DHL to the Union Twp. Construction Office on September 19, 2007 at 12:09 PM from Seely Equipment & Supply Co. Delivery person claimed that there was no one present in upstairs offices. Darlene Beam, Construction Office Secretary signed for the package at about 12:09 PM. At 12:10 PM Darlene Beam brought the Bid package upstairs and both the Clerk and Finance Officer were in their offices. Mr. Jost emphasized that in several places of the specifications, it is made very clear that no bids received after deadline would be considered. He went on to say; it is a bidder responsibility to submit bid packages on time. Mr. Jost recommendation was not to consider or even open the late arriving bid package. It was directed for the clerk to return the bid from Seely Equipment & Supply Co.

**Motion was made by Mr. Haynes, to accept and award the bid to the US Municipal Supply Inc. in the amount of \$31,324.00 for the Dump Truck Body, Central Hydraulic System, Snowplow and Material Spreader and to return the Bid from Seely Equipment & Supply Co. unopened due to late submission. Mr. Severino seconded the motion. Vote – Ayes: Mr. Haynes, Mr. Severino, Mrs. Nargi, Mrs. Dziubek, Mr. Mazza. Motion Carried.**

## VISITORS

### a. Kathy Harvey from Recreation Committee – Tennis Courts

Kathy Harvey came back before the Committee with updates regarding building tennis courts at the Finn Road Park. She said she spoke with Mr. Plushanski from Plushanski Construction and he is willing to donate his time and services by excavating the site, which would save about \$30,000.00.

Mrs. Harvey asked the Committee for guidance to move the process along.

After last discussion, Mr. Haynes contacted the Green Acres to inquire about permission to build tennis courts at the Finn Rd. Park. The answer was positive, but he said it is a quite long and costly process before permission is granted.

Mrs. Nargi suggested for Mr. Haynes to contact Township professionals to obtain estimate of cost involved before further steps are taken. Mrs. Dziubek asked Mrs. Harvey to look into grants availability from USTA. Mayor Mazza asked if Recreation Committee is planning a fund raiser to help with financing the project.

Issue of regulating use of tennis courts would have to be worked out before going forward. Mayor stated Committee is going to contact Township professionals to obtain estimates of costs involved.

### b. Robert DeChellis – FDRA LLC./Tree removal permit for Grand Colonial

Robert DeChellis, Esq. representing FDRA LLC came before the Committee regarding tree removal permit for the Grand Colonial. He stated that there is a letter issued by the Zoning Officer on tree removal violation, but no summons was issued.

He explained and apologized for his client's oversight to obtain tree removal permit before cutting down trees. He said that he would like to ratify the situation tonight to everybody's satisfaction.

John Reymann, Twp. Engineer said that trees not to be removed were clearly marked down on the site plan.

Richard McManus, Twp. Zoning officer said that at this point it is the Township Committee decision how to resolve the issue before it is filed with Municipal Court.

Mr. Haynes asked if the Grand Colonial is in violation of their submitted and approved site plan. Mr. Reymann, Twp. Engineer confirmed and stated that the final site plan has not been submitted.

Twp. Attorney, Peter Jost asked Mr. DeChellis for a time extension until next Meeting on October 3<sup>rd</sup> to render Committee decision.

### c. Edward Martin – Union Township Municipal Judge

Union Twp. Municipal Judge, Edward Martin spoke on the issue of Union Township entering into shared Municipal Court services with Clinton Township. He commented on statements made by Union Twp. officials to local newspapers.

Mr. Martin cautioned of Clinton Townships plans to accommodate new court with Police Dept. on the same premises, which would be against rules and regulations by AOC. , stating at the same time that it is AOC decision.

He urged the Committee to proceed with vigilance on the proposal dealing with shared personnel. He said that just this past April the Committee reappointed him as the Union Twp. Municipal Judge and would be responsible for the remainder of the statutory 2 ½ years term to run. He also emphasized of same regulations applying to the tenured position of the Union Twp. Court Administrator, Kathy Cupon.

Mr. Severino made a comment of appreciation on the job well done by the Court. He said, he would love to see both the Judge and the Administrator to be involved with the shared court, but at the same time it is unclear how much control this Committee is going to have over hiring of new personnel. Mr. Severino also said this Committee has an obligation to the taxpayers to keep operating costs down.

**RESOLUTION #2007-139**  
**Resolution Endorsing the “Green Acres, Farmland, Blue Acres, and**  
**Historic Preservation Bond Act of 2007”**

WHEREAS, continued investment in open space, farmland and historic preservation is vitally important to the state, as is enhances New Jersey’s economy, safeguards its remaining natural, agricultural, recreational and cultural resources and preserves its character; and

WHEREAS, New Jersey continues to face incredible pressure from development, losing over 40 acres of open space daily to new development projects; and

WHEREAS, protecting open spaces and improving community parks throughout the State, including urban areas, supports New Jersey state and local economies by stabilizing local property taxes and revitalizing communities; and

WHEREAS, the Garden State Preservation Trust, the financing authority for the Green Acres, Farmland, and Historic Preservation programs, is virtually depleted despite the continued need for the programs it makes possible; and

WHEREAS, on November 6, 2007, the voters on New Jersey will be asked to approve the Green Acres, Farmland, Blue Acres, and Historic Preservation Bond Act of 2007, which authorizes the state to issue \$200 million in bonds to fund New Jersey's preservation programs for one year and the Blue Acres program to purchase flood prone properties; and

WHEREAS, passage of the Bond Act is desperately needed to fund the continued protection of New Jersey's natural areas and cultural sites while a long-term funding solution for the Garden State Preservation Trust is determined and secured; and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the governing body of the Township of Union, in the County of Hunterdon and State of New Jersey as follows:

1. The municipality encourages the voters of New Jersey to vote yeas on the Green Acres, Farmland, Blue Acres, and Historic Preservation Bond Act of 2007 on November 6, 2007

**OLD BUSINESS**

- a. **RESOLUTION #2007-** : Amendments to the Resolution #2003-39/Reclamation Plan for Pattenburg Quarry

Information to make necessary amendments to Resolution #2003-39 is still not available. Township Engineer said we are waiting for soil erosion and reclamation plans from new owners.  
It was tabled at this time.

- b. **RESOLUTION #2007-** : 2007-2008 Liquor License Renewal – Pattenburg Entertainment Inc./Pattenburg House

Due to missing documentation from the State to renew the above Liquor Licenses the above resolution was tabled.

- c. **RESOLUTION #2007-** : Approval of the Red Hills Industries Inc. Quarry Application – per Union Twp. General Code, application transferred to the Planning Board for approval.

**NEW BUSINESS**

- a. **Discussion** – Union Township Municipal Court – Consideration for Shared Services with Township of Clinton. Action may be taken.

Attorney Jost stated that he has prepared a general ordinance allowing the Committee to enter into shared court services. He went on explaining, if the ordinance is introduced tonight and adopted after the public hearing, a resolution would have to be passed by the Committee specifying details.

Mr. Jost read the following ordinance in full and introduced same for 1<sup>st</sup> reading:

**TOWNSHIP OF UNION  
ORDINANCE NO. 2007-7**

**AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER II, ARTICLE XI, OF THE CODE OF THE TOWNSHIP  
OF UNION, HUNTERDON COUNTY, NEW JERSEY, AND PROVIDING FOR THE  
ESTABLISHMENT OF SHARED MUNICIPAL COURTS  
WITH ANOTHER MUNICIPALITY**

**WHEREAS**, the Union Township Committee has determined it to be in the best interests of the Township and its residents and taxpayers to enter into an interlocal municipal services agreement for the creation of shared municipal courts with another municipality;

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED AND ENACTED** by the Township Committee of the Township of Union, in the County of Hunterdon, State of New Jersey, that Chapter II, **ADMINISTRATION**, Article XI, **Establishment of the Municipal Court**, is hereby amended to add the following new Sections:

**2-33 SHARED MUNICIPAL COURTS**

**2-33.1 Interlocal Agreement for Municipal Court.** Pursuant to the Interlocal Services Act, N.J.S.A. 40:8A-1, and N.J.S.A. 2B:12-1c, the Mayor, on behalf of the Township Committee, is hereby authorized to enter into a shared services agreement to provide jointly for courtrooms, chambers, equipment, supplies and employees for the municipal courts of the Township of Union and another municipality, and to agree to appoint the same persons as judges and administrators without establishing a joint municipal court. Where the municipal courts of Union Township and another municipality share facilities in this manner, the identities of the individual courts shall continue to be expressed in the captions of orders and process. Pursuant to N.J.S.A. 2B:12-1.d., said interlocal agreement may be terminated as provided in the agreement.

**2-33.2 Shared Municipal Courts – Employees.** In the case of shared municipal courts, any interlocal agreement with another municipality shall provide that the municipalities agree to appoint the same persons as municipal judge, prosecutor, public defender, court administrator, and other court personnel, in accordance with applicable law. Said employees shall be compensated in the manner provided by said interlocal agreement and as otherwise established according to law.

**III. Severability.** If any section, paragraph, subdivision, clause or provision of this Ordinance shall be adjudged invalid, such adjudication shall apply only to the section, paragraph, subdivision, clause or provision so adjudged and the remainder of the Ordinance shall be deemed valid and effective,

**IV. Repealer.** All Ordinances or parts of Ordinances inconsistent with or in conflict with the Ordinance are hereby repealed to the extent of such inconsistency.

**V. Effective Date.** This Ordinance shall take effect after final passage, adoption and publication according to law.

Mr. Haynes posed a question of procedural nature regarding adopting of an ordinance. He asked if affirmative vote at introduction has to be the same at the second reading/adoption. Attorney Jost stated that it is individual's choice how to vote at readings.

Motion was made by Mr. Severino, seconded by Mrs. Nargi to adopt the above ordinance on the 1<sup>st</sup> reading. Vote – Ayes: Mr. Haynes, Mr. Severino, Mrs. Nargi, Mrs. Dziubek, Mr. Mazza. Motion Carried.

- b. **Discussion** – Union Twp. Construction Office – Consideration to transfer duties to DCA Code Enforcement Office. Action may be taken.

Attorney Jost stated that following ordinance has been prepared for the Committee consideration. Mr. Jost read the ordinance in full and introduced same for 1<sup>st</sup> reading:

**TOWNSHIP OF UNION  
ORDINANCE NO. 2007- 8**

**AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER X, BUILDING AND HOUSING, OF THE CODE OF THE TOWNSHIP OF UNION, HUNTERDON COUNTY, NEW JERSEY, AND TRANSFERRING JURISDICTION FOR THE ADMINISTRATION AND ENFORCEMENT OF THE UNIFORM CONSTRUCTION CODE TO THE STATE OF NEW JERSEY, DEPARTMENT OF COMMUNITY AFFAIRS**

**BE IT ORDAINED AND ENACTED** by the Township Committee of the Township of Union, in the County of Hunterdon, State of New Jersey, that

**I.** Sections 10-1 through 10-3, inclusive, of Chapter X of the Code of the Township of Union, regarding the function and duties of the Union Township Building Department, are hereby repealed, effective upon the assumption of jurisdiction by the State of New Jersey, Department of Community Affairs, as provided below.

**II.** The following new Section 10-1 of Chapter X, Building and Housing, of the Code of the Township of Union, is hereby established as follows:

**10-1 STATE UNIFORM CONSTRUCTION CODE ENFORCING AGENCY**

**10-1.1 Relinquishment of Jurisdiction.** The Township of Union, pursuant to N.J.S.A. 51:27D et seq. and N.J.S.A.C. 5:23-4.3, hereby relinquishes its jurisdiction of the administration and enforcement of the Uniform Construction Code and hereby transfers jurisdiction for the administration and enforcement of the Uniform Construction Code to the Department of Community Affairs of the State of New Jersey. The transfer of jurisdiction pursuant to this section shall not take effect until the expiration of 120 calendar days from the date a certified copy of this section is forwarded to the Department of Community Affairs or until the Department of Community Affairs shall exercise its jurisdiction to enforce the Uniform Construction Code, whichever is sooner.

**10-1.2 Records and Files.** The Township of Union shall deliver or make available to the Department of Community Affairs any and all records and files of the municipality necessary for the

Department to carry out its function, and the Department is hereby authorized to transfer such records and files to a location designated by the Department.

**III. Severability.** If any section, paragraph, subdivision, clause or provision of this Ordinance shall be adjudged invalid, such adjudication shall apply only to the section, paragraph, subdivision, clause or provision so adjudged and the remainder of the Ordinance shall be deemed valid and effective,

**IV. Repealer.** All Ordinances or parts of Ordinances inconsistent with or in conflict with the Ordinance are hereby repealed to the extent of such inconsistency.

**V. Effective Date.** This Ordinance shall take effect after final passage, adoption and publication according to law.

Statement was made by Mr. Severino that as the owner of the business in the township, occasionally requiring permits from the local Construction Office, he is going to recuse himself from voting on the above ordinance.

Statement was made by Mr. Jost of Mr. Haynes giving up his contraction business due to accepting a full time job as of August 20, 2007; therefore he is now eligible to vote on the above ordinance.

Motion was made by Mrs. Nargi, seconded by Mrs. Dziubek to adopt the above ordinance on 1<sup>st</sup> reading. Vote – Ayes: Mrs. Nargi, Mrs. Dziubek, Mr. Mazza. Nay: Mr. Haynes. Abstain: Mr. Severino. Motion Carried.

The Public Hearing is scheduled for October 17, 2007.

c. **Discussion** – Memo from UT Municipal Court – salary raise for Deputy Court Administrator, Jan Simonetti

Mrs. Nargi asked if Grace Brennan, Townships CFO has funding available to approve this raise. Kathy Cupon, Court Administrator stated that Jan Simonetti is taking over duties from Teresa Messino, who recently resigned from her position as Deputy Court Administrator.

Motion was made by Mrs. Nargi to grant hourly raise from \$16.00 to \$18.00 dollars, subject to availability of funds. Mr. Severino seconded the motion. Vote – Ayes: Mr. Haynes, Mr. Severino, Mrs. Nargi, Mrs. Dziubek, Mr. Mazza. Motion Carried.

d. Appointment of William Harclerode as an Alternate to the Union Twp. Environmental Commission.

Mayor Mazza officially appointed William Harclerode as an Alternate Member to the UTEC.

a. **Engineer's Report** – Mr. Reymann mentioned the following: - oil and chip contract was \$1,500.00 than awarded; - stripping has been completed; - contacted DEP on Edna Mahan regarding water allocation, talked to Ken Konar and was told they have always used more water than what was allocated; - wrote a letter to two different residents concerning driveways; - Toll Brothers will be planting trees in the mid October at the Sanctuary Development.

b. **Attorney's Report** – Mr. Jost mentioned the following: - visited the proposed site for Vincent DeFazio monument. Contacted compliance office at Green Acres on the issue and was asked to write a letter asking permission. He was told the permission would likely be granted without going through any formal process. Mr. Jost stated the letter went out today.

- c. **Mayor's Report** – Mr. Mazza mentioned the following: - acknowledged the 2007 Community Day and thanked Debbie Hirt and Bruce Rossi for organizing yet another great one. Thank you notes will be sent to all involved in preparation and helping on Community Day; - reminded that Senator Lance is coming to the next Planning Bd. meeting to honor Joseph Martin for his service to Union Twp. Community.
- d. **Committee Report**
- Mr. Haynes mentioned the following: - asked Committees permission to meet with Twp's Engineer and go over stormwater regulation and how it pertains to the Union Twp. Road Dept.; permission granted.
  - Mrs. Nargi mentioned the following: - thanked Mrs. Dziubek for greeting and welcoming Cigna Ins. Executives at Foster Wheeler biking through our Township.
  - Mat Severino mentioned the following: - met with residents complaining about noise coming from air conditioning installed on the school property; talked to school officials, who will look into the issue; - problem with household trash being dumped into recycling bin; name of resident was attained from the trash, violation notice will be sent by Bill Garrison, Recycling Coordinator. Briefly discussed were possibilities to deal with the problem.
  - Mrs. Dziubek mentioned the following: - Contacted Mary Beth Lonergan on COAH coordinator, Mary Beth indicated that it needs to be a staff person at the municipal building, usually the Municipal Clerk, would have responsibilities of keeping a list of all inquires for affordable housing (name, address, phone number) and directing the information to the Toll Brothers Affordable Housing Service; - thanked UT Environmental Commission Chairman, Mr. Nargi for his active role in obtaining funding from the Water Authority and his involvement with Milligan Farm, keeping track of all changes to the metes and bounds effecting every aspect of compliance with different regulations. **HIRING OF ELECTRICAL SUB-CODE OFFICIAL; David J. Greenhill**

WHEREAS, Kevin Fleming, has submitted his resignation as Union Township's Electrical Sub-Code Official; and

WHEREAS, David J. Greenhill is qualified to the position of electrical sub-official/inspector and expressed an interest in same;
