- I understand the Planning Board approved the application of PS Construction for the variances needed in connection with the two affordable housing units to be constructed on one of the original three subdivided lots that were subdivided prior to the next sixteen lots subdivided on the property. b. **Committee Report**

Mr. Mazza reported the following:

- All trucks are running. I want to thank the road crew for the outstanding job that they did and I want to thank the temp, Tony Tarantino. I would like to ask the Committee if this year they might consider adding a fifth person to the road crew.

Mr. Bischoff reported the following:

- "My reading of history convinces me that most bad government results from too much government." Thomas Jefferson.
- Executive session
- The bulletproof door will remain at the Court until decision made to put up for auction in the spring.
- COAH and Fair Share suit before NJ Supreme Court to endorse litigants' rights by Fair Share Housing Corporation against COAH.
- Telephone greeting script approved and scheduled to implement in the new year.

Mr. Severino reported the following:

- As we have done in the past, we supply our recycle attendants with jackets and boots. I have a request for four attendants not to exceed \$600.00.
- The signage for the bus stop on Rupell Road installed.
- Animal control is going well with the new officer.

Mr. Hirt reported the following:

- We need our search people recertified there is five on this and the other ones are already certified because they are rescue. We need \$300.00 to pay for the recertification.
- Estimates for inside and outside work for the water problem. We will set up one for outside and one for inside by the end of January.
- I want to thank the Mayor for all her hard work during the Union Hill fire in organizing a clothing drive; you did a spectacular job. Thank you to the fire companies for all their hard work at the fire.

**c. Mayor's Report**

- December 5<sup>th</sup> we had our Township Appreciation Dinner with 80 attendees and we appreciate everyone that came out. We announced our Volunteer of the Year Jack Hara.
- December 11<sup>th</sup> Mr. Mazza and I met with Mark Strauss, Fire Chief of Annandale Fire Company and is also police detective there. We continue to try to talk to surrounding communities to find out what their best practices are and services we can share and transfer of ideas. It was a great conversation.
- Our well abandonment is completed on December 5<sup>th</sup> by Stovers. Oil tank was pumped by Stem Bros. on the 16<sup>th</sup>.
- NJSEM bid through electricity auction. The auction was completed on December 10<sup>th</sup>. The price for the electricity was 9% below what they call the strike price. Our price what we pay for utilities is above the strike price. Will Contact CFO to determine how much our savings would be.

- I continue to make my occasional rounds to pick up illegal bandit signs. One issue is the Ray buys houses guy, who puts his signs up about 15 feet in the air, is it ok to ask road crew to take two of those signs down at exit 12. I will ask the Zoning Officer to call the owners of these signs.
- In our December 4<sup>th</sup> meeting we talked about contractors and small jobs (\$300.) First contact would be the DR&F, second would be Bruce Hirt and third would be list of semi-approved contractors. Mayor gave her list of contractors.
- Clean Communities Report – I finished the report through the third quarter and I sent a copy of it to the Committee. There are a few changes from last year. Community Clean Up Events are allowable expenses under the grant therefore I consider our household clean up dumpster days to be Community Clean Up Events and thus allowable expenses. I will alter the website accordingly. Tire expenses are allowable. Personnel administration expenses are allowable up to 5% of the grant total amount. Security fencing for the dumpster area is \$3940.00 and will be charged against the grant and 25% of the grant can go towards a backhoe this year that is \$3634. The \$26,000. in the account should be used up by year's end.
- We continue to receive offers of assistance to the 18 Union Hill residents displaced in late November. I am forwarding all the offers and information we get to Access Property Management the people who are responsible for the condominium complex. They are forwarding the information to the 18 residents. It is working very well and the residents are very pleased with the generosity.
- Restoration Technologies is still removing the materials from the old municipal building they will be done by January 1<sup>st</sup>.
- I wrote 25 thank you letters and Ella mailed them out to all first responders and others who offered assistance to the displaced Union Hill residents.
- I sent a copy of the article about the 43% increase in Clinton Township Sewerage Authority bills to the Committee. I thought it might merit a brief discussion during the Executive Session (contract negotiations) and how we might respond.
- An executive session for personnel to discuss our open OEM Coordinator position and an open Planning Board position.
- We have an Eagle Court of Honor on the 21<sup>st</sup> for Alex LaTournas, thanked the attorney for the proclamation.
- Incidents report for the County. Mayor gave overview of the reports for our fire and rescue squads. Mayor and Mr. Hirt will visit Hunterdon Developmental Center to discuss emergency calls.
- There was an article in the newspaper about how difficult it is to get emergency response volunteers and to get compensation for emergency services. The Mayor suggested a subcommittee to work on ways to obtain emergency response compensation to the greatest extent possible.
- Thank you to the Committee for allowing me to be Mayor this year. It has been a real pleasure and a privilege to do this. Terry Wright from the Democrat never comes to our meetings anymore because we have the most boring Township Committee meeting anywhere. We don't throw things at each other or yell at each other, we are respectful to each other. We don't always agree, but we treat each other with respect. It has been a good year from that standpoint and I want to thank everybody for working with me. It has been a lot of fun.

**18. EXECUTIVE SESSION –**

The following Resolution introduced for adoption:

**RESOLUTION #2013 - 123**

Providing for a Meeting Not Open to the Public in Accordance with the Provisions of the New Jersey Open Public Meetings Act, N.J.S.A. 10:4-12

WHEREAS, the Township Committee of the Township of Union is subject to certain requirements of the Open Public Meetings Act, N.J.S.A. 10:4-6, et. seq.,; and

WHEREAS, the Open Public Meetings Act, N.J.S.A. 10-4-12, provides that an Executive Session, not open to the public, may be held for certain specified purposes when authorized by Resolution; and

WHEREAS, it is necessary for the Township Committee of the Township of Union to discuss in a session not open to the public certain matters relating to the item or items authorized by N.J.S.A. 10:4-12b and designated below:

1. \_\_\_\_\_ Matters Required by Law to be Confidential: Any matter which, by express provision of Federal law or State statute or rule of court shall be rendered confidential or excluded from the provisions of the Open Public Meetings Act.
2. \_\_\_\_\_Matters Where the Release of Information Would Impair the Right to Receive Funds: Any matter in which the release of information would impair a right to receive funds from the Government of the United States.
3. \_\_\_\_\_Matters Involving Individual Privacy: Any material the disclosure of which constitutes an unwarranted invasion of individual privacy such as any records, data, reports, recommendations, or other personal material of any educational, training, social service, medical, health, custodial, child

protection, rehabilitation, legal defense, welfare, housing, relocation, insurance and similar program or institution operated by a public body pertaining to any specific individual admitted to or served by such institution or program, including but not limited to information relative to the individual's personal and family circumstances, and any material pertaining to admission, discharge, treatment, progress or condition of any individual, unless the individual concerned (or, in the case of a minor or incompetent, his guardian) shall request in writing that the same be disclosed publicly.

4. \_\_\_\_\_ Matters Relating to Collective Bargaining Agreements: Any collective bargaining agreement, or the terms and conditions which are proposed for inclusion in any collective bargaining agreement, including the negotiation of the terms and conditions thereof with employees or representatives of employees of the public body.
5. \_\_\_\_\_ Matters Relating to the Purchase, Lease of Acquisition of Real Property or the Investment of Public Funds: Any matter involving the purchase, lease or acquisition of real property with public funds, the setting of banking rates or investment of public funds, where it could adversely affect the public interest if discussion of such matters were disclosed.
6. \_\_\_\_\_ Matters Relating to Public Safety and Property: Any tactics and techniques utilized in protecting the safety and property of the public, provided that their disclosure could impair such protection. Any investigations of violations of possible violations of the law.
7. X Matters Relating to Litigation, Negotiations and the Attorney-Client Privilege: Any pending or anticipated litigation or contract negotiation in which the public body is, or may become a party. Any matters falling within the attorney-client privilege, to the extent that confidentiality is required in order for the attorney to exercise his ethical duties as a lawyer.
8. X Matters Relating to the Employment Relationship: Any matter involving the employment, appointment, termination of employment, terms and conditions of employment, evaluation of the performance of promotion or disciplining of any specific prospective public officer or employee or current public officer or employee employed or appointed by the public body, unless all the individual employees or appointees whose rights could be adversely affected request in writing that such matter or matters be discussed at a public meeting.
9. \_\_\_\_\_ Matters Relating to the Potential Imposition of a Penalty: Any deliberations of a public body occurring after a public hearing that may result in the imposition of a specific civil penalty upon the responding party or the suspension or loss of a license or permit belonging to the responding party bears responsibility.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Township Committee of the Township of Union, assembled in public session on December 18, 2013 at 8:26 p.m. in the Union Township Municipal Building, 140 Perryville Road, Hampton, New Jersey, for the discussion of matters relating to the specific items designated above.

It is anticipated that the deliberations conducted in closed session may be disclosed to the public upon the determination of the Township Committee that the public interest will no longer be served by such confidentiality.
